

# PARENTAL/ LEGAL GUARDIAN CONSENT FORMS

## FOR MINOR CHILDREN TRAVELING OUTSIDE OF THE UNITED STATES.

In Addition To The Child's Citizenship Documentation, A Minor Child Under The Age Of 18 Must Have A Legal Guardian, Or Parental Consent Form From Their Parents To Exit The United States And Enter Most Foreign Countries. Parents Should Complete One Of The Forms Listed Below For Each Minor Child Under The Age Of 18 (*At The Time Travel Starts*) To Prevent Immigration Problems When Entering Or Leaving The Country.

### **When The Form Is Completed, ONLY SIGN It In The Presence Of A Notary Public!**

**Form #1 - Both Parents Are Alive with One Parent Not Traveling** - If both parents are alive, and one of them WILL NOT be traveling with minor children, the non-traveling parent must complete the form giving a notarized affidavit of consent to the other parent traveling with the child(ren), their authorization to take said minor child(ren) in and out of the United States and travel to other designated countries.

**Form #2 - Both Parents Are Alive with Both Parents Not Traveling** - If both parents are alive and both WILL NOT be traveling with minor children, then both parents must complete the form giving a notarized affidavit of consent to the person traveling with the child(ren) their authorization to take said minor child(ren) in and out of the United States and travel to other designated countries.

**Form #3 - Non-Traveling Surviving Parent and One Parent Is Deceased** - If the surviving parent WILL NOT be traveling with minor children, the parent must complete this form giving a notarized affidavit of consent to the person traveling with the child(ren) their authorization to take said minor child(ren) in and out of the United States and travel to other designated countries, and attach a certified copy of the death certificate for the other non-living parent.

**Form # 4 - Non-Traveling Legal Guardian** - If the legal guardian WILL NOT be traveling with their minor child(ren), the legal guardian must complete this form giving a notarized affidavit of consent to the person traveling with the child(ren) their authorization to take said minor child(ren) in and out of the United States and travel to other designated countries, and attach a certified copy of their legal guardianship documents.

**Form #5 - Non-Traveling Single Parent with Sole Custody** - If the single parent with sole custody WILL NOT be traveling with their minor child(ren), they must complete this form giving notarized affidavit consent to the person traveling with the child(ren) their authorization to take said minor child(ren) in and out of the United States and travel to other designated countries, and attach a certified copy of their court custody document.
