- ☒ Volunteers must practice cultural sensitivity at all times. No jesting or making fun of cultural issues is allowed. The best way to keep a good attitude is to practice cultural sensitivity at all times.
- ☒ The dress code must be followed. Inappropriate attire can be very offensive in various cultures. If you have questions, contact your Project Coordinator about specifics for your project.
- ☒ No volunteer is allowed to consume alcohol, tobacco, or carry a firearm — regardless of offers, personal convictions, or culture. This rule includes training camp, during the project, and travel to and from the project.
- ☒ Do your best to keep a Christ-like attitude. We must represent Christ in all we do. It may be tough at times, but the only option is a good, positive attitude.
- ☒ Use language, behavior, and attitudes which are consistent with the Christian faith.
